 - 10. **District** Nov. Senior Advisor: Service **Vietnam** Beyond. 2 p.m. As the nation commemorates the 50th anniversary of the Vietnam War, the will museum host Smithfield resident Al Coke who served in Vietnam from 1967 to 1968 and from 1969 to 1970. After completing training with the District Senior Advisor's Program, he and other graduates



discovered that this program trimmed assimilation time from their service in Vietnam. Training in language, weapons and State Department fundamentals were essential at the beginnings of the Pacification Program which aimed at turning over the war to the Vietnamese. Veterans are encouraged to join us and share some of their Vietnam memories. The museum is a United States of America Vietnam War Commemoration Partner and will offer official lapel pins to Vietnam veterans at this event. 23 guests.

- Nov. 14. Tell Me a Story. 10 a.m. This program, geared for children ages 3 to 5, introduces youngsters to the symbols of Isle of Wight County and features books, songs and games. Theme: Thanksgiving. 21 students.
- Nov. 17. A Vital Connection: The James River Bridge. 2 p.m. Opened November 17, 1928, the James River Bridge has linked Warwick-Newport News to Isle of Wight County for 91 years. This look-back examines life before the bridge, when colonial ferries and steamers served this purpose. The historical journey continues with dedication of the original crossing and construction of the present one. 33 guests.

 life of Benjamin Huger, 1805-1877, the career U.S. Army ordnance officer who fought
 with distinction during the Mexican-American War and served as a Confederate general
